Blue Wren Subcommittee

Objectives -

To implement the Subcommittee's policy statement (following) especially through:

- increasing the diversity, abundance and distribution of indigenous fauna and flora;
- establishing a network of wildlife corridors linking key habitat areas;
- involving the local community in habitat creation and enhancement activities.

Policy statement

The Blue Wren Subcommittee endorses the recommendations of the 2008 report **Superb Fairy Wren Habitat in Glebe and Forest Lodge – a community based conservation project** (also endorsed by the Glebe Society) and will work towards their implementation. In doing do the Subcommittee will:

- 1. Work to value, retain and enhance biodiversity in Glebe and Forest Lodge, and its bays and foreshores, for current and future generations.
- 2. Foster the education of residents, businesses and other parties leading to an increased awareness of the value of native plants and animals in our suburb.
- 3. Liaise (including lobbying, and the provision of information, perspectives and feedback) with the City of Sydney and other organisations to retain and enhance biodiversity in our suburb.
- 4. By organising planting days and other events, actively promote the enhancement of biodiversity in our suburbs' parks, school grounds, light rail corridor, and private gardens, with special emphasis on the density, structure and type of plantings needed to provide habitat for small birds.
- 5. Promote local bushcare volunteer organisations who support the continued establishment and maintenance of biodiversity in our suburbs' parks and other open spaces.
