



DEFEND YOUR HOME

The proposed new planning laws will demolish the current NSW planning system and residents' protections. Premier O'Farrell and Minister Hazzard claim that these changes are necessary to drive growth in NSW, but the proposals offer free kicks to developers and silence community voice – environmental protection comes a poor second.

Councils will lose power to defend residents against developers, the Good, the Bad and the Ugly. 80% of development decisions will be made by a certifier within 10 days or less. Your only opportunity to restrain overdevelopment will be at the initial stages, when you can comment on fundamental controls for your area, such as height and density. Once regional controls have been approved you have no further say. Your right to object to particular development applications, both large and small, will be abolished. If a development complies with the area controls it could be approved within a few days. The Government proposes to do away with the current zones in the Local Environment Plans and replace them with 13 new zones prepared by Councils in consultation with their community.

Moreover, if the Minister for Planning thinks the regional control plan is too restrictive he or she can overrule it. In effect Part 3A, which gave the Minister power to approve a development even if it broke the rules, will become permanent as part of the legislation.
