PRUNING IN WENTWORTH PARK

The lopping of the row of Moreton Bay fig trees on Pymont Bridge Road in Wentworth Park was a bad example of destroying natural beauty recklessly.

According to the Park Manager, Mr. A. Gray, some of the trees were diseased. But that did not warrant the indiscriminate and far too severe lopping that took place. Tree pruning has to be done from time to time for various reasons, but it seems that tree pruning in Glebe becomes a tree-massacre all too often. Next year the Society plans to look into the question of tree-logging methods in great detail. We feel sure that trees can be properly trimmed without being reduced to ugly stumps.

THE POLLUTION THREAT

Dr. D. Martyn, President of the Australian Academy of Science, addressed nearly 200 people at the Glebe Town Hall last month. In speaking on pollution, he described four main threats: air pollution, water pollution, the noise problem and over-population. He spoke of Sydney Harbour silting up; of asbestos in the air from brake linings causing lung cancer; and of the ways in which Pymont power station, and others, could eliminate their smoke. The need, he says, is for action now, before it is too late.
