HAVE YOU SEEN THE SPANGLED  
DRONGO? OR THE BIRDS OF  
JUBILEE PARK - BARA MARSH



The winter day in 1981 when the Estate Agent first showed me our present home in Victoria Road was a glorious one, but the house was utterly grim and grotty - until he took me out on to the back verandah overlooking Jubilee Park. As I stood there amidst the debris, disconsolately weighing up the possibilities of ever turning the treeless rubbish dump at my feet into a garden, five glorious pelicans (*Pelecanus conspicillatus*) soared over the trees of the park, lightening my heart and stirring my imagination as to what might be done. Unfortunately I've had the pleasure of seeing them in flight there only once since.

There followed six months of blood, sweat and tears during which there was not much time for bird watching. However, eleven months have now passed since we moved in and although no written record has been kept, a good deal of bird life has been noticed.

Perhaps the birds seen most often and in largest numbers are the Silver Gulls (*Larus novaehollandiae*) with their glorious soaring flight far off over the bay, changing from white to silver as they wheel towards or away from the light. After rain the oval is white with them. One day in April the oval had a little lake just where the batsmen have stood all summer and two White Faced Herons (*Ardea novaehollandiae*) were looking for a score of juicy worms.

For a couple of weeks in April we had the pleasure of the company of a Spangled Drongo (*Dicrurus hottentotus*). The Monday Ladies Group said I must be joking - but not so. This lively bird is a migrant who comes south from Queensland towards the cold in winter and is perhaps therefore considered to be a bit eccentric - hence "drongo"? Sydney is about the end of his range.

He is the size of a small starling but although also iridescent about the head and breast can be distinguished by his blacker look and forked spoon shaped tail. His song resembles a creaking whistle and he hawks for insects.

Talking of Starlings (*Sturnus vulgaris*) the Park has been alive with them recently - hopefully they are preparing to migrate. Unfortunately they were introduced from Europe during the last century and are a dangerous pest. Should they penetrate your roof to nest you can be in big trouble as they harbour small red blood sucking mites. When the young birds leave the nest, the mites are left with no blood to suck except yours. They then descend through ventilators, etc., into your bathroom or bedroom to wreak havoc on your skin and cause a rash which may take weeks to cure, meanwhile driving you crazy with itching. Other introduced birds which harbour mites are domestic pigeons (*Columba livia*) so it's best to see that these don't nest in your roof either.
