## HORSE TROUGH - ST. JOHNS ROAD

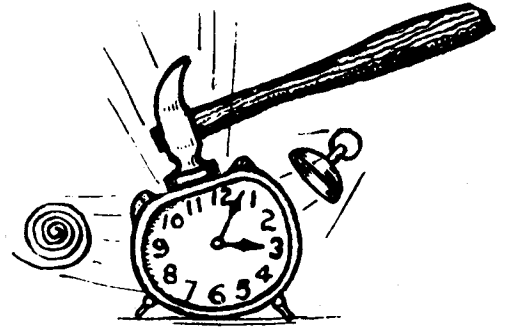
The Society has been urging the Leichhardt Council to return the horse trough to its original position now that work on 128 St. Johns Road is completed.

We are being supported in our efforts by the Heritage Council of New South Wales and The National Trust.

The National Trust pointed out that their case would be greatly strengthened if the horse trough had been classified. It may be too late to classify the horse trough but let us learn from this mistake.

In order to consider an item for classification, the Trust requires a comprehensive set of information, including color slides and a sketch plan of the item. They have sent us a set of guidelines which outlines the requirements in some detail.

Remember you are not eligible to vote if your membership is not current. To function efficiently the committee must include:

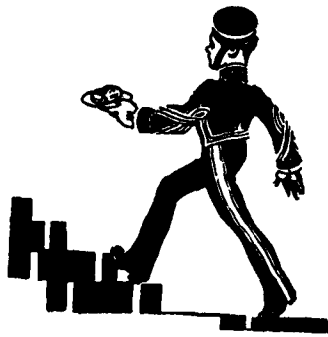
- a President

#### PET CATS - BE WARNED

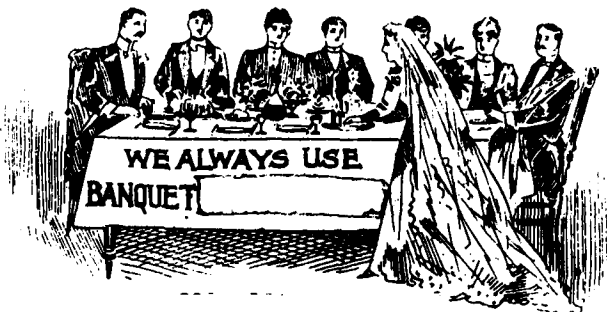

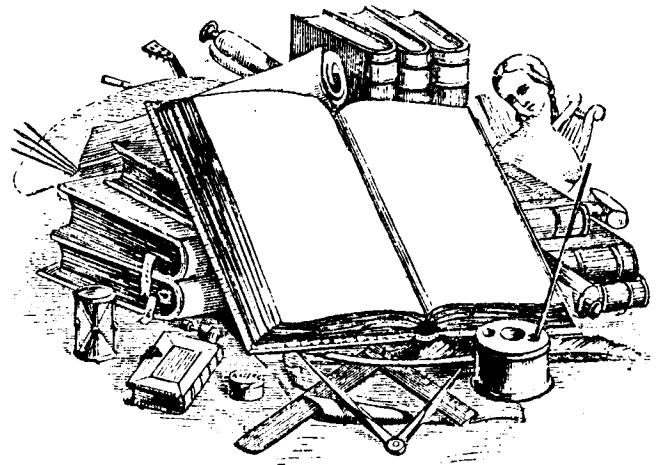
